

We give 100% support at the service, but sometimes professional intervention, beyond our remit, becomes desperate, leaving us very little room and scope to try to prevent a decline, its heartbreaking to watch, knowing that you have explored every avenue to get the support needed.

On the upside the sun was out in its intensity and have been blessed with some beautiful weather this summer, a bit too hot for some, but it did not stop the team from planning more experiences and memories for our ladies at 3 Winns Mews. The suncream and sun hats came out, bags were packed with goodies and off they went, to Brent Cross Man made beach, what an experience. Is this not

what its about. This has to be the highlight of the month. It was lovely to see the majority of service users participate in this activity and share their experience, with the staff on their return. They just loved it, due to the fact that they had never been to anything like this before, they just want to see and experience more and more of what's out there to enjoy.

One of our ladies took a trip down to Nottinghill carnival, she said it was brilliant, since it has not been on since 2019, due to the pandemic, she was so excited, as it got closer to the bank holiday, she was oozing with happiness, she danced the day away, with her family and friends, lets not forget the aching legs the following day, but she said it was all worth it. She also experienced a make up tutorial with our gifted and creative Tamara, this is something she has never done before, so for her she also learnt how to apply her makeup, which she also enjoyed, there is not stopping us at Winns Mews.

Winns Mews 2

The month has been great at Winns, the service users are in really good spirit and doing great. Sadly one of our services users mental health declined and had to be returned to hospital but he is doing better.

It is the most rewarding feeling when your teams work and knowledge has made a massive change in anyone's life, but for us at Winns Mews, knowing how difficult it is for our service users who are constantly being told that they need support and wont be able to do, gives us that push to find ways to ensure that they achieve their goals. RT came to 2 Winns Mews in May 2022, he lacked confidence and general skills to manage his day to day living. He required support to do almost everything apart from his personal care, which needed prompting on a daily basis. He was quiet and withdrawn.

The work has been intense but the reward has been greater, oh is he vocal now, yes he is, RT is now confident with regards to his level of communication, he tells us what he wants and how he wants it done, this is what we want, for everyone to have their say and there voice to be heard, as it is their right. He cooks a mean omelette to perfection but still requires support with managing the cooker and keeping safe. This month he has soared with his cooking skills, he has learnt how to cook steak.

roast potatoes and spag Bolognese. He is now putting his clothing in the washing machine and acknowledging when they require washing, cleaning his room with little prompting but with some support or more so guidance. He has enjoyed the trips that have been arranged, with his input, since coming to Winns, he has been to Brighton, Southend, Thorpe Park, Alexander Palace and loved every minute of it. We have now joined him with the local library, of which he attends twice a week, he is asking to go to the library, rather than us asking him. Most of all, his ability to say I am happy here, and openly thank Isaac and Christopher for the things they do, that make him happy means a lot.

PKP: Was unfortunately admitted to hospital in July and still remains there. He is doing better.

KF: Went into the city to visit his friends by bus, this is a massive achievement, since he asked for an oyster card, made his way there and came back safely. He is still loving his PS4. AM: is loving living in Tottenham and has made new friends in the community. he cooks his meals without support and still has us smiling on a daily basis, since he is always making cracking one liners that have us in stitches. HNS: Has been staying at the service more, this is a massive achievement, he is engaging well but still spends his time with his family and in

the community doing his own thing.
