



Sarah has been enjoying her weekly activities.



The month has been an exciting one for the residents and staff, so many different things have been learnt about the individuals that we are supporting, there has been great encouragement by the support staff, to bring the best out in all of the male residents at Winns.

The residents have been spending lots of time relaxing together in the lounge, this has given them the time to get to know each other better, they are all very patient and never seem to complain about anything. As the weeks have progressed it is becoming more apparent that the blend of service users under one roof was a good one as they are all gelling really well, playing cards, listening to music, sharing food, laughter has be consistent for all, including the staff.

Star of the month has to be KF, he had his Placement review, which was overwhelming for all, since he said the most beautiful things about Winns Mews, being his home and told them that he is happy there, as he has everything that he needs, "I can have a shower and be in my own space, keep warm and really like the staff, as they look after me, Isaac plays video games with me and I enjoy this, I do not want to move anytime soon", those were KF's words during his review. A big shout out to Isaac, since he has proved to be a great support worker, who has bonded well with KF and helped his selfconfidence to grow. This job can be the most rewarding, when you hear it from the service users perspective.

HNS is slowly but surely making Winns Mews his home, he is spending more time in the service and bonding with the other residents and staff, he has been cooking in the service more and playing cards and music that everyone enjoys. He has invited the manager to have dinner with them and has given Isaac a list of produce to buy so that he can cook for everyone, now this has to be a positive step forward. He is ready to go to work, this is something that we will be looking into soon. We will keep encouraging and empowering HNS, to change his mind set and start progressing with his dreams, I feel a good vibe coming from HNS. We have to be hopeful

as everyone deserves a chance.

PKP has settled back into Winns after being discharged from hospital last month, he is a different person, he is happy, the communication barriers are being managed really well, by continuing with using the google translator, but what we have established is that gradually, he is learning new words daily and using them, when requesting support from the staff. Muna has created pictorial cards and sits with him to teach him more of the English language, he shocked us, as he knew a lot of the words and pictures that he was shown. PKP loves music, whilst cooking was going on in the kitchen, we furned around and PKP was having his own rave in front of the TV, we loved it. He is also a good cook and enjoys shopping and cooking some really lovely food, fish being his favourite one. We tried some paint by numbers art with PKP, he did really well. He requested that he wanted to

buy a new tracksuit and some footwear, Muna supported him to do this, he enjoyed his day out and has proved to have very good taste in clothing.

RT has grasped his cookery skills and is doing really well with following instructions and getting involved in becoming more independent. He has



been requesting to go to the library more, since he enjoys using the computer, so we plan this as part of him being out in the community, since he is learning and wanting to improve his computer skills.

AM is doing well we are still encouraging him to take part in activities but he has been encouraging a lot of the male bonding in the service, he is very bubbly, enjoys talking, making jokes and bringing that homely family feel to the home, he also has been eating much better, since he was extremely underweight, we contacted the GP of whom referred him to a dietician, he is now eating well and his put on weight. Another delightful month at Winns.

PKP: spent the month settling back in, shopping in the community, enjoying music, cooking and chilling with his co residents and the staff, he appears to be happy.

KF: Has been visiting his friends in Woodgreen, shopping, playing his PS4, challenging himself to get to the next level, when he is having difficulties with the game, he calls upon Isaac to rescue him.

HNS: has really settled in well and is engaging with the staff and his co residents, he is staying in more and relaxing in the lounge, cooking and really taking time to make that change.

RT: has been out in the community, shopping and going to the library, he has been in a good place and also has become more confident with doing his shopping.

AM is his usual bubbly self, enjoying time in the lounge and with his co-residents, making everyone laugh.
